CALOPTIMA HEALTH AWARDS \$5.1 MILLION FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT IN ORANGE COUNTY

Six Organizations to Receive Funding to Train More Providers to Deliver Mental Health Services for Orange County's Medi-Cal Population

ORANGE, Calif. (November 13, 2024) — To better support members experiencing mental health challenges, <u>CalOptima Health</u> has awarded \$5.1 million in grant funding to increase the behavioral health workforce as part of our ongoing Provider Workforce Development Initiative.

Six organizations will receive funding to help address critical behavioral health workforce shortages, enhance training and education opportunities, and ultimately improve access to essential mental health and substance use disorder services for CalOptima Health members. The grantees include:

This funding builds on the initial \$24.6 million CalOptima Health <u>awarded</u> in April 2024 as part of a larger five-year, \$50 million Provider Workforce Development Initiative aimed at enhancing the health care workforce across Orange County. The initiative is focused on increasing access to care by supporting the recruitment, training and retention of qualified health professionals. With the distribution of the remaining \$20.3 million still ahead, CalOptima Health will consider areas of greatest need to ensure equitable and accessible health care for our diverse membership.
