

## Medi-Cal EHR Incentive Program California Technical Assistance Program Health Information Exchange Organizations

Participation in CalOptima's California Technical Assistance Program includes support services to providers and practices in connecting to available health information exchange infrastructure, including community or enterprise health information organizations, and point-to-point health information exchange.

Electronic health information exchange allows doctors, nurses, pharmacists, other health care providers and patients to access and securely share essential medical information electronically—which has the potential to improve the speed, quality, safety and cost of patient care.

Medi-Cal requires that health care providers participate in health information exchange with a health information organizations that is a participant in the California Trusted Exchange Network (<u>CTEN</u>) and a signatory of the California Data Use and Reciprocal Support Agreement (<u>CalDURSA</u>).
