



What's New With OneCare?

CalOptima Health offers a Dual Eligible Special Needs Plan called OneCare (HMO D-SNP) that provides health coverage to seniors and people with disabilities who are entitled to both Medicare and Medi-Cal.^{1,2} For the 2023 contract year, there are some drug changes and new benefits as described below.

OTC Catalog Supplemental Benefit

OTC drugs are not covered by Medicare Part D.³ Medi-Cal may cover some OTC drugs but not all. With no out-of-pocket costs, OneCare members receive a \$80 quarterly allowance to spend on over 500 plan-approved OTC health and wellness items. A prescription is not required for OTC catalog items.

- The full allowance must be used in one order. Unused benefits will not roll over into the next quarter.
- The order total may not exceed the allowance.
- OTC products are intended for member use only.
- OTC items are available for home delivery only.

Enhanced Drug Coverage

Some prescription drugs or their indications are excluded from Medicare Part D and Medi-Cal coverage. One such excluded indication is the treatment of erectile dysfunction (ED). Effective January 1, 2023, OneCare will be offering enhanced coverage for the treatment of ED. This new enhanced drug benefit includes up to four generic sildenafil tablets per month.
