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### **MINUTES**

### SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CALOPTIMA HEALTH BOARD OF DIRECTORS' WHOLE CHILD MODEL FAMILY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

### October 25, 2022

A Special Meeting of the CalOptima Health Board of Directors' Whole-Child Model Family Advisory Committee (WCM FAC) was held on October 25, 2022, CalOptima Health, 505 City Parkway West, Orange, California and via teleconference (Zoom) in light of the COVID-19 public health emergency and of Assembly Bill (AB) 361 (Chaptered September 16, 2021), which allows for temporary relaxation of certain Brown Act requirements related to teleconferenced meetings.

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Kristen Rogers, WCM FAC Chair called the meeting to order at 9:33 a.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

At this time Chair Rogers rearranged the agenda while awaiting to achieve a quorum.

### **CEO AND MANAGEMENT REPORTS**

### **Chief Executive Officer Report**

Michael Hunn, Chief Executive Officer, shared that CalOptima Health currently has 930,000 members and of those approximately 303,000 were children. He noted that his goal was to ensure that CalOptima Health had enough providers for these children. Mr. Hunn also noted that vaccination and immunization rates have fallen and that CalOptima Health is continuing its outreach to get these rates up going into the winter flu season. CalOptima Health is tracking ER visits due to Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) as there is a big increase in cases right now and that RSV was also affecting seniors over 65.

Michael Hunn also notified the committees that if the Public Health Emergency (PHE) ends, CalOptima Health members would go thru a redetermination and that 20% of those members could become ineligible. CalOptima Health is gearing up to make sure that there is enough staff to handle the redetermination and were working hard to get the message out that redetermination is coming. In addition, CalFresh will revert to the old method of determining the eligibility benefit which will impact our members.

### **Chief Operating Officer Report**

Yunkyung Kim, Chief Operating Officer, began by thanking the upcoming speakers who will discuss redetermination. She also presented a proposed policy for the committee to provide feedback and noted that this policy defines maximum enrollment of one-third (1/3) total eligible members in one of our delegated health networks. Once a health network has 1/3 of eligible members, auto assignment would stop but the family link would continue. In the area of children, CalOptima Health would continue to use 1/3 of child members for calculating. She noted that Cheryl Simmons will send the Auto-Assignment policy to the committee for review and feedback after the meeting.

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### **Chief Medical Officer Update**

Richard Pitts, D.O., Ph.D., Chief Medical Officer – Dr. Pitts provided a COVID 19 update and noted that hospital numbers for our members were low but there was a new variant that he was keeping his eye on. Dr. Pitts also shared that the new COVID vaccine is very effective as it contains the different variant strains for better protection from COVID. Dr. Pitts also reiterated what Michael Hunn had said about RSV and noted that it is very active right now and has arrived somewhat early in the season and is keeping the emergency rooms very busy. He also noted that monkeypox and congenital syphilis seemed to be fading.

At this time, Chair Kristin Rogers asked to establish a quorum.

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### **INFORMATION ITEMS**

### **California Children Services Update**

Doris Billings, CCS Division Manager/Chief Therapist, Orange County Health Care Agency provided an update on the operations of the California Children Services (CCS) and noted that the PHE had been extended thru Feb. 2023 and that CCS will continue with COVID flexibility in the general program. She also noted that CCS is starting to close cases in the Medical Therapy program and plan to have them closed by the end of 2022. Ms. Billings also provided an updated on how CCS is working with the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to clarify language in both the Whole-Child Model (WCM) letter, the CCS letter, the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) template and the All-Plan letter. They all address the WCM concept and process, but they were not consistent so they're working on that. She also noted that the state is guaranteeing telehealth reimbursement for Occupational Therapy & Physical Therapy services thru 2022 for the Medical Therapy Program but no guarantees past December 31, 2022. They will work on guidelines for 2023 but will continue to offer telehealth. Most services are now in person and noted that about two months ago, all CCS Medical Therapy Clinics transitioned to in-person unless virtual was requested.

### **Medi-Cal and Medicare Redetermination**

The WCM FAC received information on the redetermination effort underway by the Orange County Social Services Agency (OC SSA) that is being undertaken in preparation for the end of the public health emergency. Jamie Peterson, Administrative Manager I of the OC SSA presented on the redetermination effort. Ms. Peterson noted that when the continuous coverage requirement expires, Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services guidance outlines a 14-month timeline for states to return to normal eligibility and enrollment operations and that the OC SSA would have 14 months to initiate and complete the redeterminations for nearly all Orange County beneficiaries. She also noted that Medi-Cal beneficiaries would maintain their current renewal month in their case records and that SSA would conduct a full redetermination at the next scheduled renewal month following the end of the Public Health Emergency (PHE).

Jeffrey Rodriguez, South Coast Public Affairs Specialist with the Social Security Administration presented on the redetermination efforts and its effect on the Supplemental Security Income (SSI). Mr. Rodriguez explained that SSI is a federal program that provides monthly payments to people who have limited income and resources for individuals who are 65 or older, as well as for those of any age, including children, who are blind or who have disabilities and have limited income and resources. He noted that approximately 54,000 Orange County beneficiaries would be affected.

# Committee Discussion on California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) Enhanced Community Supports for Respite Care

Kelly Bruno-Nelson, Executive Director, Program Implementation, lead a discussion on respite care by asking the committee which generated a discussion on the best use of respite care. Some suggestions received were: out of bed disability summer camp, in-home, overnight respite care (level of caregiver would depend on needs of patient), billing agent for respite care, and patients

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being admitted to hospital because there was no one to care for them. Chair Kristen Rogers agreed to send Ms. Bruno-Nelson a list of camps.

### **Whole-Child Model Member Updates**

Chair Rogers informed the committee that there are still two family member seats available on the committee that need to be filled and asked the members to assist with recruitment. She also reminded the members that the email providing them with information on how to access the yearly compliance courses was sent on September 6, 2022. These courses will need to be completed by November 4, 2022. Chair Rogers also reminded the committee members that the next meeting would be the joint meeting of all the advisory committees on December 8, 2022, at 8 a.m. and that March 21, 2023 would be the next meeting for the committee.

### **ADJOURNMENT**

Hearing no further business, Chair Rogers adjourned the meeting at 11:20 a.m.

### a. CalOptima Focused on Informing Members About Upcoming Medi-Cal Redetermination

The Medi-Cal redetermination process will resume on April 1 (with the first disenrollments on July 1). Starting in April, the County of Orange Social Services Agency (SSA) will do an ex parte review to automatically renew members using available data, such as state wage databases, to confirm ongoing eligibility. If confirmed, members will receive notices informing them about their renewal, and they will not need to take any action. To help our members keep their coverage if the ex parte process doesn't renew them and they receive a renewal form, we have created a comprehensive communications plan to inform and educate the community over the 14 months of redetermination. We have also created an online toolkit of resources that our providers, community-based organizations and other trusted messengers can use to share information with members about the redetermination process. CalOptima Health is seeking their help to amplify two messages: First, members need to notify SSA if their contact information has changed over the past three years, and second, they need to complete the renewal process to keep their Medi-Cal.

### b. State Joint Legislative Audit Recommendations - Pending

The California State Auditor (CSA) is wrapping up its audit of CalOptima Health as approved by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC) back in June of 2022. The auditors are finalizing document reviews and interviews with staff and an exit conference is expected the week of March 6. A draft audit report will be provided to CalOptima Health, and staff will have five business days to review the draft report and prepare a written response. A special CalOptima Health Board meeting will convene a closed session to review the draft audit recommendations and any responses to the auditors. The final report is then expected to be released publicly in April.

### c. Annual Medi-Cal Audit Set to Begin February 27

CalOptima Health has completed preparations for the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) routine, annual medical audit, which will be underway starting February 27. This year is considered a full-scope audit, and as such, many areas not audited in recent years are included (i.e., Cultural & Linguistics, Health Education, Privacy, Complex Case Management, etc.). As in previous years, the

Medi-Cal Regulatory Affairs & Compliance department coordinated CalOptima Health's participation in the audit, which will continue through March 10.

### d. Medical Directors Represent a Broad Array of Specialties

Under the leadership of Chief Medical Officer Richard Pitts, D.O., Ph.D., and Deputy Chief Medical Officer Zeinab Dabbah, M.D., J.D., CalOptima Health's Medical Directors offer medical expertise in a broad array of specialties. ### e. California Association of Housing Authorities' Presentation

Kelly Bruno-Nelson, Executive Director of Medi-Cal/CalAIM, presented at the California Association of Housing Authorities (CAHA) annual conference in Sacramento on January 26. She spoke about the intersection of housing and health and how CalOptima Health is partnering with our four local Housing Authorities to increase housing opportunities in Orange County. CAHA is a statewide association representing more than 75 housing authorities throughout the state of California.

### f. National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey Hosts Media Event

Chief Medical Officer Richard Pitts, D.O., Ph.D., and I attended the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey (NHANES) media event earlier this month. Speakers at the open house event included Dr. Pitts; Board of Supervisors Chairman Don Wagner and Supervisors Vicente Sarmiento, Doug Chaffee and Katrina Foley; Tony Nguyen, M.D., NHANES Chief Medical Officer; and Regina Chinsio-Kwong, M.D., County Health Officer. <u>KFI AM Los Angeles</u> ran a clip of Dr. Pitts being interviewed at the event.

### g. CalOptima Health Welcomes New Executive Director, Medicare Programs

Javier Sanchez has joined CalOptima Health as the new Executive Director, Medicare Programs. He will oversee Medicare programs, including OneCare, PACE and future programs for seniors. Previously, he held executive roles at CalOptima Health from 2008–16, leading our contracted health networks and launching our direct network, now known as CalOptima Health Community Network. Javier went on to serve in executive roles for CHOC Health Alliance, providing strategic and operational direction for the physician/hospital organization, and for Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, leading Medi-Cal contracting efforts across California. Most recently, he was a vice president at Innovative Integrated Health Community Plans and the CEO of a new Medicare Advantage plan he launched in the California Central Valley.

### h. CalOptima Health Board Appointments Pending Board of Supervisors Action

Following the resignation of Supervisor Andrew Do from the CalOptima Health Board of Directors, the Orange County Board of Supervisors (BOS) is expected to finalize the appointment of Supervisor Vicente Sarmiento at its meeting on February 28. Since Supervisor Sarmiento already occupies our Board's alternate seat, he will immediately fill the regular seat regardless of the formal appointment date. At the same meeting, the BOS will also appoint a new alternate, who has not yet been determined. Relatedly, the Orange County Health Care Agency continues its recruitment effort for our designated legal/accounting seat formerly held by Scott Schoeffel, but there is currently no expected timeline for the BOS to appoint a candidate.

### i. Security Enhancements Installed at CalOptima Health's Building

As part of CalOptima Health's security enhancements at the 505 building, we have installed a new security camera monitoring system and emergency blue light stations throughout the property. There are six stations located in the main parking lot and one station located at the entrance facing The Outlets at Orange.
