About Medi-Cal and Immigration Status

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security and U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services does NOT consider health, food and housing services as part of the public charge determination. Therefore, using Medi-Cal benefits (except for nursing home or mental health institution care) will NOT hurt your immigration status.

The new law that expands Medi-Cal is funded by California. When you apply for state-funded benefits, your information is only used to see if you can get Medi-Cal. State laws protect the privacy of your information.

The California Department of Health Care Services and county social services agencies cannot answer questions about immigration status or public charge. If you have questions, talk to a qualified immigration lawyer.

The California Department of Social Services funds qualified nonprofit organizations to give services to immigrants who live in California. These organizations serve Orange County.
